Private Land	Granted Mining (M) or Prospecting (P) Tenement	Permission of Land owner and Tenement holder required.
	Granted Exploration (E) Tenement	Permission of Land Owner Required and Section 40e permit. NOTE you can EITHER get written permission of the Tenement holder or a Section 40e Permit.
	No (E), (M), Or (P), i.e. is Unpegged land. OR Pending (E), (M), Or (P), Licence	Permission of Land Owner Required
NOTES	See Private Land Provisions for application for permit to enter Private Land (Form 2)	It's better to get the permission of the land owner in our opinion.
Pastoral Leases	Granted Exploration (E) Tenement	Prior notice to Pastoral Leaseholder and Section 40E Agreement required. NOTE you can EITHER get written permission of the Tenement Holder or a Section 40e Permit.
	Granted Mining (M) or Prospecting (P) Tenement	Written Permission of Mining Tenement Holder Required and prior notice to Pastoral Leaseholder
	No (E), (M), Or (P), i.e. is Unpegged land. OR Pending (E), (M), Or (P), Licence	Prior notice to Pastoral Leaseholder
NOTES	Prospecting on Pastoral Leases Pamphlet	It's all about Respect and Safety – make sure you communicate with the Pastoralist when you go onto their leases. Follow the link and read the Prospecting on Pastoral leases Pamphlet for other rules.
Crown Land subject to a lease for grazing and Timber	Granted Exploration (E) Licence	Prior notice to Leaseholder and Section 40E Agreement required
	Granted Mining (M) or Prospecting (P) Tenement	Permission of Mining Tenement Holder Required and prior notice to Leaseholder
	No (E), (M), Or (P), i.e. is Unpegged land. OR Pending (E), (M), Or (P), Licence	Prior notice to Leaseholder
